Since COVID-19 the agency has made attempts to reach out to each of you, person to person. Your support will enable us to determine the federal funding levels for Baltimore City, local communities and the number of congressional seats assigned to Maryland.

# **Baltimore City Recycling Update**

#### Recycling will NOT be collected from residences in Baltimore City beginning August 31.

The Department of Public Works, the City agency responsible for trash & recycling pickup, faces staffing shortages due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the recycling suspension will allow staff to focus on timely trash collection. Recycling collection may resume after November 1, depending on DPW staffing levels.

Are you ready to meet new people, get out of your comfort zone, and build a more connected Baltimore? <u>Thread</u> is an innovative, nationally-recognized, homegrown community weaving a new social fabric in Baltimore, and is looking for volunteers to join our community virtually during COVID-19. Social distancing should not mean social isolation, and Thread is here to bring people together in this unprecedented time.

What does Thread do? Thread is often mistaken for a mentoring program or tutoring group, but we're really a community of individuals working to end our social isolation by rallying around Baltimore's most academically-underperforming and highest potential 9th graders. Thread volunteers work in groups with a single young person, building relationships that transcend lines of race, class and zip code. Young people in Thread consistently defy the odds: 85% of Thread students have graduated from high school within six years, and 83% have completed a college degree or certificate program.

Dr. Anne O. Emery was a lifelong educator in Baltimore. She received a bachelor's degree at Tuskegee University and later earned a master's degree in education from what was then

Morgan State College and a doctorate in education from Temple University. She was a vice principal at Lemmel Junior High School in 1960. She was principal at Walbrook High School from 1971 through 1980. In 1980 to 1989 she became an assistant schools superintendent.

She was a leader in the Ashburton community for decades and loved that neighborhood, worked hard to preserve it and took great pride in it.

She was just a fantastic person, and there are not enough words to describe the type person Anne Emory was. She was empathetic, compassionate, and would help people at the drop of a hat. She was all about the kids and the people she worked with. She inspired the people who worked for and around her because she wanted to see growth in them also.

She was a founder of Heritage United Church of Christ in 1963.

She was a daughter, sister, wife, mother, mother-in-law, grandmother, great –grandmother, and friend. She is the grandmother to GMCC's Treasurer, Tyrone McNeill.

Older adults may be eligible for:

- Home Safety Improvements (e.g. grab bars, handrails)
- Home Rehab Services (e.g. roof repair, plumbing repair)
- Energy Efficiency Upgrades (e.g. LED and CFL light bulbs)
- Weatherization Services (e.g. insulation, caulking of foundation)
